TECHNOLOGY

The CCCD Canvas taskforce has been meeting and is focused on ensuring that the College addresses challenges in Canvas and continues to develop the system to meet the Colleges' needs. The Go Print (pay-as-you-print) system has been installed at the Newport Beach Campus.

FACILITIES

Le-Jao Café renovation is expected to be completed by the end of winter break. Newport Beach is looking to have a similar café and will be hosting food trucks. A decision to rebuild the entire College Center versus renovate utilizing Measure M monies is under consideration due to the building's earthquake vulnerability. Recommendations from Coastline will be presented to the Chancellor and the Board of Trustees for the final approval.

BUDGET

Vice Chancellor Dunn presented the 2017-18 Adopted District Budget Summary. The committee reviewed the College's ending balance report.

GUIDED PATHWAYS

A college-wide self-assessment was conducted to gauge the College's level of adoption of Guided Pathways with regard to inquiry, design, and implementation.
