

# Associate in Arts in Elementary Teacher Education for Transfer

COASTLINE COMMUNITY COLLEGE

The Associate in Arts in Elementary Teacher Education for Transfer (AA-T), prepares students for a seamless transfer to CSU campuses that offer bachelor's degrees in Liberal Studies or Integrated Teacher Education Programs. Students earning the Associate in Arts in Elementary Teacher Education for Transfer will be granted priority for admission as a Liberal Studies or Integrated Teacher Education Program major to a local CSU, as determined by the CSU campus to which the student applies.

Students are required to complete their transferable units including completion of CSU GE or IGETC and units in the major with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better. Title 5 requires that students earn a grade of "C" or better in all major coursework. Four-Year institutions do not recommend students take major prep courses for Pass/ No Pass.

The Associate in Arts in Elementary Teacher Education for Transfer is designed for students who will be transferring to a four-year institution, obtaining a Bachelor's degree and pursuing a teaching credential through a California State University (CSU) integrated or traditional teacher preparation program.

1. Upon successful completion of the program, students will have acquired a streamlined seamless pathway for transfer to a CSU campus for a Degree in Liberal Studies or similar major, eventually leading to a credential to teach in elementary school classrooms.
2. Upon completion of the Associate in Arts in Elementary Teacher Education for Transfer, students will demonstrate a strong foundation in introductory content area subject matter requirements for teaching at the elementary school.
3. Upon completion of the requirements students will be able to make an informed decision regarding pursuing a multiple subject teaching credential.
4. Upon successful completion of required fieldwork courses students will be able to document ability to work effectively with students, teachers, parents, colleagues, and administrators in a school and classroom setting.

Course and degree requirements may vary at each CSU campus. The required courses are the courses listed in the core, copied below. The remaining units to complete 60 units for the degree, can be chosen from List C and/or other applicable CSU transferable courses that may be required by the specific CSU. Therefore, for optimum course selection it is important that students consult with a Counselor and respective university transfer representative to confirm program requirements, course selection, and transferable work.
