The college also has an administration building (housing the President's Office, Admissions Office, Bookstore and more) in Fountain Valley, California.

The college serves more than 14,000 students every semester. More than 10,000 additional students take Coastline classes through distance learning each year while serving in the U.S. Military at bases all over the world.

Coastline offers Associate (A.A.) degrees, Certificates of Achievement, Certificates of Accomplishment, Certificates of Specialization and all of the necessary courses for students wishing to transfer on to a four-year college or university.

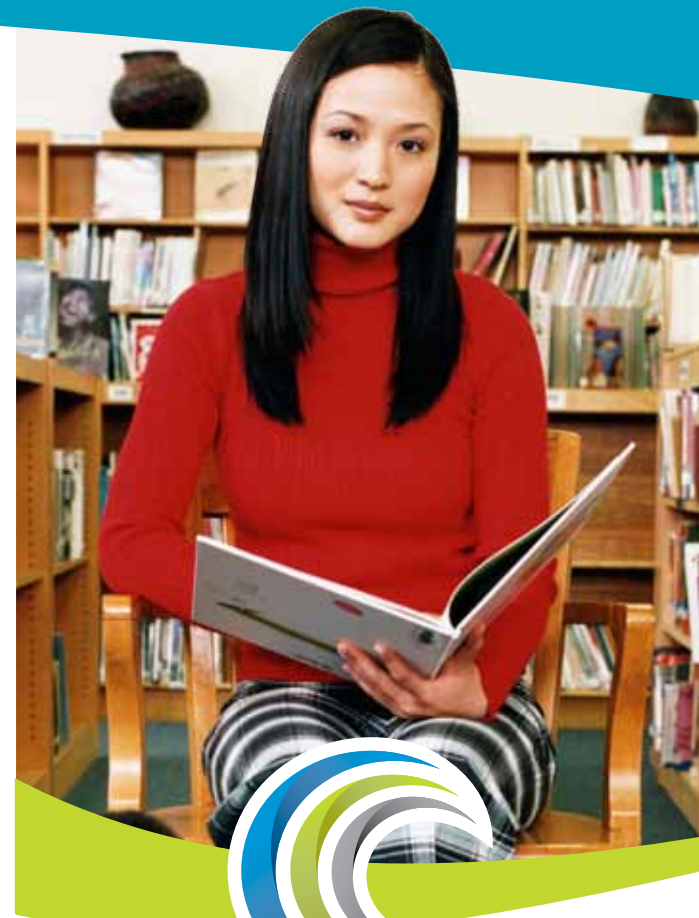

The courses are taught by U.S. instructors in China on the Xiang Jiang High School campus, and are transferable to most U.S. community colleges as well as U.S. public and private universities.

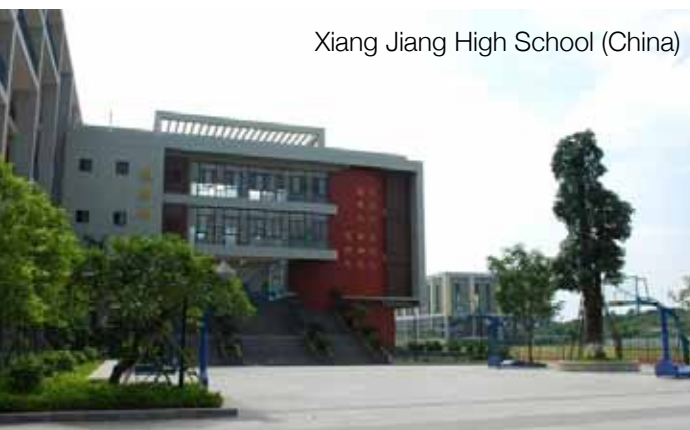
Although the program does not guarantee admission to a U.S. college or university, it prepares students for successful transition into the American higher education system.

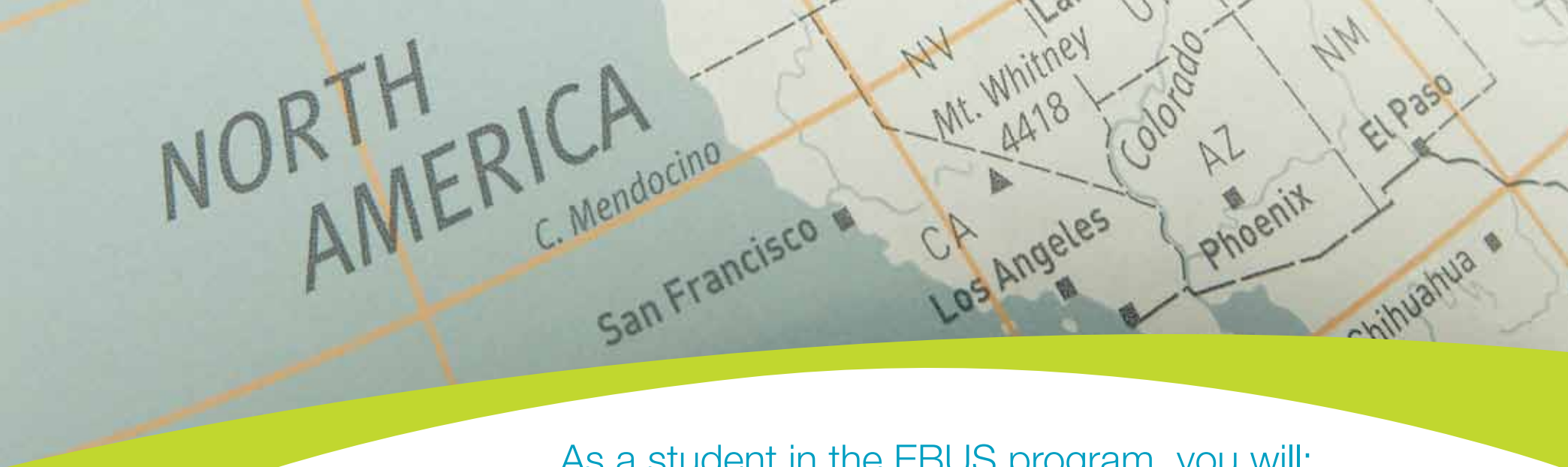

Xiang Jiang High School (China)



In collaboration with Xiang Jiang High School in China, the EBUS program offers Chinese students American college courses to prepare them to transfer to a U.S. college or university!

As a student in the EBUS program, you will:

- Acquire college-level skills appropriate for transfer to U.S. colleges and universities, including advanced English-language skills. These skills will prepare students for the *Test of English as a Foreign Language* (TOEFL) exam.
- Earn up to 38 transferable U.S. college units towards a degree at an American university.
- Receive intense classroom and computer-assisted instruction with individual attention and small class sizes.
- Learn about U.S. culture, customs, colleges, and more! Learn how to apply to U.S. colleges and about the selection process, refine your study skills and test-taking strategies, and plan ways to become a successful U.S. college student.
- Establish your individual learning plan with a college Academic Counselor from Coastline Community College and attend college guidance workshops.
- Improve your English reading, grammar, writing, listening comprehension, and speaking skills.
- Be introduced to extracurricular activities as practiced in the United States, such as participating in service projects and student clubs.
- Interact with students from around the world.
- Be eligible for a U.S. "Summer Abroad" program.

Additional program goals

- You will obtain the motivation and skills needed to conscientiously pursue on-going academic, occupational, and personal growth.
- You will obtain the requisite skills of independent and critical thinking, problem solving, articulation, and organization.
- You will become more aware of human diversity, gain respect for that diversity, and will be able to maintain open communication with a wide range of people.
- You will obtain knowledge, self-esteem, motivation, and self-discipline, including the capacities to overcome adversity, accept boundaries, and maintain high standards.
- You will acquire college-level skills appropriate for transfer to U.S. colleges and universities, including advanced English-language skills.
- You will be a productive, environmentally aware, and economically independent citizen who will contribute positively to our global society.

A successful first year!

During the 2009-2010 school year, EBUS students accomplished the following:

- 70% of all EBUS students developed their English-language skills enough to take Music 100, a college-level transferable course.
- All students who participated in Music 100 earned passing grades and now have 3 units of U.S. college credit.
- The entire Senior 1 class raised their Comprehensive English Language Test (CELT) scores by 1.3 levels.
- 26% of EBUS students raised their CELT scores by at least 2 levels.
- English-listening skills jumped from 40% to 70%.

How to get started in the EBUS program:

1. Apply for admission to Xiang Jiang High School and the EBUS program.
2. Interview with the Coastline Program Director on-site at Xiang Jiang High School.
3. Review the EBUS Handbook and sign the Student/Parent Expectations Contract.

Upon acceptance, students will:

- Take English-language assessments administered by Coastline Community College personnel.
- Develop an individual learning plan with a college counselor.
- Enroll in English-language development courses and transfer-level college courses (general college courses) according to eligibility based on English placement tests and counselor recommendations.
