What Is Extended Opportunities Programs And Services?

Coastline Community College's Extended Opportunities Programs and Services (EOPS) is a state-funded program whose aim is to provide the academic, personal and financial support necessary for students whose educational and socioeconomic backgrounds might limit their access to higher education, or hinder their ability to be academically successful as they begin their college level studies. The full set of services provided to eligible EOPS students are designed to address these obstacles and help students achieve their educational goal(s): Associate's degree, Certificate and/or preparation for transfer to a 4-year institution.

Interested students who meet EOPS eligibility criteria are expected to follow-through on all program requirements as a condition of receiving the full range of program benefits and services, such as:

- Priority Registration
- Individualized and Group Academic Counseling

- Academic Progress Monitoring
- Assistance with Transfer Goal-Setting and Applications
- Textbook Assistance (vouchers and book loans)
- Skill-Building Workshops
- Tutoring
- Student Recognition/Award Events
- Grants and Emergency Loans

Nickle & Nail



In November 1971, the Executive Committee of the California Community College EOPS Association adopted this symbol to represent the program's intended outcomes.

The nickel symbolizes the "over and above" benefits provided by EOPS to help students who, in spite of having various challenges in their lives, are motivated to start and complete the educational journey necessary to reach their academic and career goals.

The twisted nail symbolizes the value of education in helping
