## **BP 5010 Admissions Policy**

### **General**

The Coast Community College District shall admit to any District college any California resident possessing a high school diploma or equivalent. The Coast Community College District may admit to any District college any apprentice and any other person who in the judgment of the Chancellor of the Coast Community College District is capable of profiting from the instruction offered. The terms of admittance are subject to regulations and definitions as set forth in Education Code Section 76000, policies adopted by the Coast Community College District Board of Trustees, and procedures established by the Chancellor of the Coast Community College District.

### **K-12 Grade Students**

The Coast Community College District may admit as a special part-time or as a special full-time student under the provision of Education Code Sections 76001 or 76001.5, respectively, any student in grade K-12 who in the opinion of the Chancellor of the Coast Community College District may benefit from the instruction to be taken. Admittance is subject to procedures established by the Coast Community College District Chancellor.

### **Students on Visa Status**

In accordance with United States immigration laws, students on visa status may be admitted to District colleges when in the opinion of the Chancellor of the Coast Community College District those persons are capable of profiting from the instruction offered. All persons on visa status in order to be admitted must have a visa that does not expire prior to the end of the term for which they wish to enroll. All persons admitted on visa status will be classified according to District residence classification policy and are subject to all applicable fees. The following restrictions apply to persons on visa status:

G1 Limited to two courses

G2 No enrollment restrictions

Limited to two courses

I - Foreign Press

I1 Limited to two courses

I2 No enrollment restriction

J - Exchange Visitor

J1 Limited to two courses

J2 No enrollment restriction

K - Fiancé(e) No enrollment restriction

L - Intra-Company

L1 Limited to two courses

L2 No enrollment restrictions

M - Foreign Student

Must see foreign student advisor (vocational)

## **Open Enrollment**

Unless specifically exempted by statute, every course section or class, the average daily attendance of which is to be reported for state aid, wherever offered and maintained by the District, shall be fully open to enrollment and participation by any person who has been admitted to the college(s) and who meets such prerequisites as may be established pursuant to Section 58100 of Title 5.

## **Special Programs**

In accordance with Title 5 Section 58106, each college may impose additional requirements for admission to specific instructional programs which require special skills, knowledge, competencies, or other qualifications as determined by the Chancellor. Admittance to Special Programs is subject to procedures established by the Chancellor. Such requirements shall be published in appropriate documents by each college. Programs for which prerequisites are established for admissions to the program are as follows:

Administration of Justice Academy Program at Golden West College

Allied Health Programs at Orange Coast College

Nursing Program at Golden West College

Psychiatric Technician Program at Golden West College

Recording Arts Program at Golden West College

Traumatic Head-Injury Program at Coastline Community College
