COURSES **OUR ACADEMIC PROGRAM** **ADVENTURE, LANGUAGE, & CULTURE**

Students will earn eight units of transferable college credit while studying the Spanish language and geography. Students must enroll in one of the two Spanish language classes, and the geography class. All classes are offered through Coastline Community College.

Geography

GEOGRAPHY C185 **3.0 Units**
Cultural Geography

This course surveys the broad landscape of global cultures in terms of their spatial distributions and interactions. It focuses on how culture shapes physical spaces, how humans perceive these spaces, and how culture and place define people's lives and identity. Transfer Credit: CSU; UC

SPANISH C180 **5.0 Units**
Elementary Spanish 1

Advisory: Students who have completed two years of high school Spanish with a grade of "C" or better should enroll in SPAN C185 or C185A.

This course is designed to develop the student's fundamental ability to both comprehend and converse in daily spoken Spanish. Early reading and writing skills are introduced as well as the customs and culture of the Spanish-speaking world. Transfer Credit: CSU; UC credit limitations. See counselor.

SPANISH C185 **5.0 Units**
Elementary Spanish 2

Prerequisite: SPAN C180, C180B with a grade of "C" or better, or completion of two years of high school Spanish with a grade of "C" or better.

This course is a continuation of SPAN C180 or C180B and is designed to further the student's ability to comprehend and converse in daily spoken Spanish at the second semester level. Reading and writing skills are expanded. Introduction to various cultural and philosophical aspects of the Spanish-speaking world will continue with authentic reading materials and selected literary works. Spanish C185A and C185B are equivalent to Spanish C185. Transfer Credit: CSU; UC credit limitations. See counselor.

Julie has traveled extensively throughout Europe and the Middle East. She lived in Argentina and Spain and knows a variety of accents and vocabulary from Spain and Latin America. She also lived in Italy where she was an assistant professor of both English and Spanish at the Istituto Orientale University in Naples, Italy. She was formerly a student on three study abroad programs and speaks several languages fluently. Julie believes that learning a foreign language is a positive experience as it broadens our horizons and increases openness to other cultures. "When we speak another language we are also speaking the culture of that language. Learning a foreign language is also a great way to get to know people from other cultures."

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Robert Franklin has been teaching Geography courses in the Coast Community College District for over 25 years. Since 2013, he has been teaching World Regional Geography and now Physical and Cultural Geography at Coastline Community College.

Mr. Franklin has traveled extensively.

As a young man, he traveled to Mexico and Hawaii many times. He went to Indonesia in 1974 and drove to El Salvador in 1977. He also has extensive experience traveling to islands in the Pacific Ocean and his recent trips include Sumatra in 2013, Costa Rica in 2014, and Central Mexico in January of 2015.

His educational background is as follows: Earned an A.A. degree from Golden West College; a B.A. degree in Geography with a minor in Environmental Studies from CSU Long Beach and a M.A. degree in Geography with an emphasis in Urban Studies from CSU Long Beach. After graduation he went into urban planning and held various positions with the cities of Costa Mesa, Huntington Beach, and Fountain Valley.
