Eligibility - Selective Service Required

- If this is required for your file, it appears you have may not have met the Selective Service requirement for financial aid. Male students born on or after January 1, 1960 (50 USC 453) who fail to register with Selective Service before turning age 26 are ineligible for Federal student loan and grant programs, including Pell Grants, Federal Work Study, and Stafford Loans.
- If you are a male, between the ages of 18-25 years of age, please register now at <u>http://www.sss.gov/default.htm</u> (or if you have already registered) Then, submit proof of registration to our office.
- If you are 26 years of age or older, and you never registered due to one of the reasons listed below, you <u>MUST submit to our office a signed statement along</u> with supporting documentation (i.e. I-94-Green Card; hospital, prison, <u>court, or parole documents, DD214, etc.</u>) regarding why you failed to register between the ages of 18-25 years of age:
 - Men who are serving in the military on full-time active duty are not required to register. Men attending the service academies are also not required to register.
 - o Noncitizens who first entered the US after turning age 26.
 - Noncitizens who entered the US as lawful non-immigrants on a valid visa and remained in the US on the terms of that visa until after they turned 26.
 - o Students who are not yet 18.
 - Men who are hospitalized, institutionalized, or incarcerated are not required to register during their confinement.
 - However, if they are released before their 26th birthday they must register within 30 days of their release.
 - Disabled men who were continually confined to a residence, hospital or institution are not required to register.
 - Non-immigrants visiting the US on student or visitor visas and men who are part of a diplomatic or trade mission and their families.
 - Citizens of the Federated States of Micronesia, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, or the Republic of Palau.
