1.04 Approval of Minutes

The flag salute was led by Jonathan Jimenez, not Richard Rosete, and on a motion by Tom Boscamp and seconded by Wilson Peng, ASG voted to approve the minutes of October 10, 2014 with the change of name. The motion carried unanimously.

II. Public Comment

Martha Morales presented ideas to reintroduce the Bookstore as a resource to students at Coastline such as offsite events at Newport or Garden Grove such as a VIP Night the week prior to the start of the next semester. Ms. Morales would like to collaborate with ASG on upcoming Bookstore events.

III. Unfinished Business

A motion was made by Wilson Peng and seconded by Naomi Lambert to move Unfinished Business 3.01 to after 3.02.

3.02 SSCCC General Assembly meeting

A motion was made by Tom Boscamp and seconded by Andy Vu to approve the attendance of Naomi Lambert, Chau Nguyen, Vong Nguyen, Andy Vu and Wilson Peng at SSCCC General Assembly. The motion passed unanimously.

3.01 ASG Movie Night

Decorations and signage were presented by Andy Vu. Mr. Vu and Tom Boscamp are meeting at Costco on October 31st to purchase the remaining supplies needed for the event. Mr. Boscamp reported on the AV equipment availability and plans for its usage that night. He will also confirm security for the evening. Nathan Brais will request later key card access for that evening and will send a reminder to the Board of Trustees. Mr. Brais will also request an introduction from Ross Miyashiro. Mr. Boscamp will coordinate thank you cards for the volunteers who assist with the event.

3.03 ASACC meeting

The ASACC trip will be canceled due to a lack of hotel rooms for the event. Nathan Brais will follow up on the refund of any fees paid.

3.04 Student Life Achievement Project (SLAP)

Scholarship eligibility was discussed, including the number of units required as well as a GPA requirement. The scholarship amount per student was also discussed. Promotion of SLAP will ideally be started before the spring semester. Tom Boscamp motioned to table further SLAP discussion until the subcommittee meeting. The motion was seconded by Wilson Peng and was passed unanimously.

3.05 ASG Club survey

Andy Vu will chair the survey for the questionnaire with Naomi Lambert and Wilson Chang as co-chairs. Mr. Vu suggested hosting workshops for students on how to start a student club, create by-laws, etc.

A motion was made by Wilson Peng and seconded by Tom Boscamp to hear 4.03 EOPS/CARE request at this time.

4.03 EOPS/CARE request for funding, NTE \$4025

Christina Arellano-Duenas presented an overview of EOPS and CARE and the basic requirement for students to qualify for services. EOPS students must be full-time, eligible for BOG waiver A or B, and must have fewer than 30 units if applying for the first time. The CARE program is for students with children under the age of 13. These programs provide school supplies, emergency loans, counseling and workshops. The request for funding of \$4025 is for an end of year toy drive and Stater Bros gift cards on December

5th for \$3025 and the EOPS/CARE Advisory Committee and Student Awards Ceremony Advisory Committee meeting and awards ceremony for \$1000. Tom Boscamp motioned to approve the funding and Andy Vu seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

3.06 New Member ASG training

New member training will be planned in the future for new members, but existing members may attend as well.

3.07 Key card update

Nathan Brais will follow up with Carol Spoja on the key cards.

3.08 Nametags for ASG members

Nametags will be available for the movie night.
