1. **What is Accreditation and why is it important?**
 - a. Accreditation is a formal recognition that a college meets high educational standards.
 - b. Accreditation is important because it ensures a high quality education for students.
2. **Who are we accredited by? Which division?**
 - a. Coastline College is accredited by the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC) of the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC), an institutional accrediting body recognized by the Commission on Recognition of Post-secondary Accreditation and the U.S. Department of Education.
3. **What is the purpose for the Accreditation visit March 18-21, 2013?**
 - a. Accreditation is granted for a maximum of six years at which time a self-study is conducted, followed by a WASC accreditation visit. Coastline was granted initial accreditation in 1978. The WASC team will visit on March 18-21, 2013 in preparation for the college's regular accreditation renewal.

 - b. **College founded in:** 1976
 - c. **Basic facts about Coastline:**
 - Sister college to OCC and GWC
 - Three campuses—in Garden Grove, Newport Beach, and Westminster
 - Administration building is in Fountain Valley
 - Classes on-site and via Distance Learning
 - Coastline serves approximately 12,000 students a semester (unduplicated enrollment)
 - Coastline serves an additional 5,000 students a semester through Coastline Military Programs (for enlisted military).
