# What is the purpose for the Accreditation visit March 18-21, 2013?

Accreditation is granted for a maximum of six years at which time a self-study is conducted, followed by a WASC accreditation visit. Coastline was granted initial accreditation in 1978. The WASC team will visit on March 18-21, 2013 in preparation for the college's regular accreditation renewal.

#### **Basic facts about the Coast District:**


- Founded in 1947
