Fall Book Vouchers will be available starting August 1, 2021.

The Student Equity book voucher is awarded to eligible students in Fall, Spring, and Summer terms based on program funding availability, student program eligibility and financial aid eligibility. Students participating in the Book Voucher program agree to return their books to the Student Equity Office at the conclusion of the semester, to be donated to the Coastline lending library.

- Students taking 7+ units may receive a \$300 voucher, Students taking 1-6 units may receive a \$150 voucher.
- Purchases may be for your required course books/materials only.
- There will be no cash back for unused amounts.
- No cash refunds will be given for items purchased with this voucher.
- Return of any books purchased with this voucher is subject to the return policy of the bookstore.

Submit application for Fall starting August 1. Submit a Book Voucher Application

The program does not guarantee a book voucher service. It is contingent upon student eligibility and available funds. All exchanges and returns are done at the bookstore in compliance with the bookstore's return/exchange policy.

All books and required course material (lab kits) purchased are subject to audit. Violation of any of the above terms will result in the requirement to reimburse the college for the total amount of books purchased with the voucher. The individual will also be excluded from future voucher eligibility.

Book Voucher Eligibility

To be considered for the SEA book voucher, students must meet all the eligibility criteria listed below:

- Must be a Coastline student. Student must be registered for Fall 2021
- Must be enrolled in 3 units at Coastline College or completed 6 units the previous term.
- Must be impacted in a way that prohibits your student success.
- Must have completed the SEA student assistance application.
- Must have sufficient unmet need as determined by the Financial Aid Office.

Students already receiving supplement book voucher assistance from other programs such as EOPS, CARE, NextUp, Guardian Scholars, CalWORKs, College Promise, AB19, or Veteran, do NOT qualify.

For Fall and Spring semesters, eligibility criteria will be checked immediately after the last withdrawal deadline in the preceding semester. All eligibility criteria must be met at that time.

Dreamer Resources

California Dream Act

The California Dream Act, comprising state laws AB 130 and AB 131, has extended eligibility for certain types of institutional and state aid to students. The legislation allows students who meet specified criteria to receive the California College Promise Grant (CCPG) and the Cal Grant. Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) students and AB 540students are also eligible for scholarships.

Students who submit a <u>California Dream Act Application</u> are automatically considered for the CCPG, which waives the registration fee. Students can also apply separately using the CCPG application. This application is unrelated to the federal DACA program.

California's Assembly Bill 540 is a bill signed by Governor Gray Davis on October 12, 2001. This bill allows undocumented students who meet certain requirements including citizens, permanent residents, and undocumented students, may be eligible for an exemption from the nonresident tuition fee.
