The team also identified a lack of consistency in outreach materials. To resolve this issue, the team proposed the development of a toolkit to be used at all outreach events.

In order to maintain consistency with messaging and to provide cohesive outreach efforts for the college as a whole, the team decided that training was needed and should be developed and delivered following an iterative and incremental model: Planning, Analysis and Design, Implementation, Deployment, Testing, and Evaluation.

ENTER

Register: Enroll based on educational plan.

Prepare: Obtain supplies; become familiar with academic and student support services and program faculty.

How have we impacted the student experience?

First Year Experience Course
